FROM THE RABBI

The holiday of Shavuot which we are about to celebrate, commemorates the revelation on Mount Sinai and the transmission of what is known as "the ten commandments" to the Jewish people. The rabbis tell us that this occurred on Shavuot as the entire nation, men women and children, stood around Mount Sinai and heard God speak these words. Each person heard God speak to the entire nation.

When we examine the text of the Ten Commandments, we would notice that even though God was speaking to the entire nation, He utters these words in the singular and not in the plural. "I am the Lord your God who took *you* (singular) out of the land of Egypt"; *You* (singular) shall not bow to other gods, nor worship them; never using the plural construct in all these commandments. If He was speaking to the entire nation, why use the *singular* form rather than the plural?

Rabbi Mordechai HaKohen of Tzsafat, a scholar and kabbalist from the late 16th century who became the rabbi of Aleppo, Syria in 1570, explains this, as follows.

If God would have spoken in the plural form, one may interpret this to me that if *other* Jews are observing the mitzvah then that is sufficient. Me, an individual Jew, need not observe them and I am perhaps even exempt from the observance. God is telling us that the requirement of observance is the responsibility of every one of us.

We are all expected to observe Shabbat in the best way that we can. Certain individuals may have their own customs in observance, but each of us must observe! We are all required to honor our parents, even when there are other siblings who seem to do a good job. And none of us, individually, may steal from others – or from the government.

Observance of Torah comes from studying it, when we can discover what behaviors are acceptable and which are forbidden. By adopting the practice of study, even a little every day, we will discover that our knowledge will grow and our behaviors become more acceptable to all those around us.

Let us commit to spending a few minutes of Torah study each day for the next year. That would make this Shavuot special and meaningful. I wish all of you a *Chag Sameach*!

Shavuot Customs and Practices

When: Shavuot begins on Tuesday, June 11th at night, and lasts through the day of Thursday, June 13th.

Candle Lighting: As with every Yom Tov, we light candles each night of the holiday, reciting the 2 brachot – one for the holiday (*l'hadlik ner shel Yom Tov*) and the *Shehecheyanu*. *Shehecheyanu* is also recited at the end of Kiddush.

Tikkun Leil Shavuot: Since Shavuot commemorates the revelation at Mount Sinai and the acceptance of the Torah, there is a beautiful, time-honored custom to stay awake the entire night of the first day of Shavuot and study Torah. *Since there are no plans to gather together for Torah study, it is certainly proper and praiseworthy for each person to spend at least some of the first night of Shavuot in Torah study, either individually or with your immediate family.*

Megillat Rut: There is a custom to read the scroll of Ruth on the second day of Shavuot. Ruth, who was a convert, accepted the Torah just as the Jews did at Sinai. She was also the great grand-mother of King David, who was born, and died on Shavuot. We read the megillah before the Torah service.

Yizkor: Yizkor is recited on the second day of Shavuot after the Torah reading.

Dairy Foods: There is a custom to eat dairy foods on Shavuot. Thus, the annual Beth David Sisterhood Shavuot lunch on the second day of Shavuot will be dairy.
